

PAST TENSE VERB ENDING SOUNDS

When 'ed" sounds like T - Verbs ending in voiceless sounds [p, k, θ , f, s, f, tf] cause the "-ed" ending to be pronounced as the voiceless [t] (with no vocal chord vibration).

- Talked
- walked
- laughed
- kissed
- brushed
- reached
- milked
- washed

When 'ed" sounds like D - Verbs ending in the voiced sounds $[b, g, \delta, v, z, 3, d3, m, n, \eta, r, l]$ cause the "-ed" ending to be pronounced as a voiced [d].

- breathed
- love
- lived
- rolled
- farmed
- combed
- moved

When 'ed" sounds like id - Verbs ending in the sounds [t] or [d] will cause the "-ed" ending of a verb to be pronounced as the syllable [əd] or [ɪd].

- visited
- ended
- wanted
