



PAST TENSE VERB ENDING SOUNDS

When ‘ed’ sounds like T - Verbs ending in **voiceless sounds** [p, k, θ, f, s, ʃ, tʃ] cause the “-ed” ending to be pronounced as the **voiceless [t]** (with no vocal chord vibration).

- Talked
- walked
- laughed
- kissed
- brushed
- reached
- milked
- washed

When ‘ed’ sounds like D - Verbs ending in the **voiced sounds** [b, g, ð, v, z, ʒ, dʒ, m, n, ŋ, r, l] cause the “-ed” ending to be pronounced as a **voiced [d]**.

- breathed
- love
- lived
- rolled
- farmed
- combed
- moved

When ‘ed’ sounds like id - Verbs ending in the sounds [t] or [d] will cause the “-ed” ending of a verb to be pronounced as the syllable [əd] or [ɪd].

- visited
- ended
- wanted
